

## **DIRECTOR NOTES**

I haven't encountered a play like *Tiny Beautiful Things*. Its non-linear compilation of various stories evokes so many emotions that can be deeply familiar or weirdly disorienting. I was immediately attracted to its honesty and overt love for all things human. But I barely knew where to start. There isn't a right or wrong way to direct a play like this; I never found a guidebook. The story, if there is one, is experienced through an accumulation of individual moments...just like life. So, in the end, we are attempting to create a portrait of life.

I love the kind of "kitchen table wisdom" shared throughout the play. Brutal honesty mixed with compassion becomes Sugar's style. Her abundant love and constant focus on the need to accept the truth of our lives is the overriding element that sustains the play.

I think that each of you will find something of yourselves here today. Seeing ourselves in the stories told here provides us with insight and even hope. Everyone knows loss and failure, rejection and anger. Everyone seeks to be less alone and seen for who they truly are. I hope you have a Sugar in your life. I, thank God, had a Sugar to help me through the deepest personal sorrow of burying my child. Whoever has the generous courage to share their own loss in order to comfort another is a miracle. I dedicate this play to all who have the grace and love to be a Sugar to someone in their life.

Well, hard as it is...here we are sharing our gift of wisdom and love via a leap of theatrical faith. Using a theatrical concept termed "Magical Realism," the Letter Writers amble in and out of Sugar's mind, filling her thoughts as she completes the mundane objectives of domestic life. They are real to her, and she dives deep within herself to share an experience that may alleviate their pain. Thank you for jumping into this world with us.
